
Together, they create a welcoming and supportive environment where dogs can excel and student and owners feel empowered.

Course summary

We'll set specific trails we'd like to complete, you'll film them and send them in to your mentor for review and feedback.
- Final practical video assessment to demonstrate your ability at running a trailing session. When your virtual trail sessions and practical homework are complete you'll be given your final practical assessment which will involve running a trail session. This will need to be filmed and submitted in full (no edits) to your mentor for final assessment!
- Facebook support group run by the founders of The Canine School of Trailing.
- Opportunity to become affiliated with The Canine School of Trailing on successful completion of the course.

How does it work?



Once enrolled, you'll receive a welcome email from your mentor. In this email, you'll be invited to book your first mentor call —a friendly, one-on-one video or phone session designed to set you up for success.

How much time does the course take?

- To be willing to keep up to date with relevant developments, to improve their own skills and to expand their knowledge.
